

Don't leave out the kids!

As you read through your Bible this year, you have a unique opportunity to share this amazing experience with your children! They may not have the attention span or vocabulary to follow along with a grown-up Bible, but there are many options available for younger readers. God's Word is for everyone, and the conversations that come out of reading together may be invaluable.

How does it work?

- Readings are broken up into weekly chunks from children's Bibles that align with the full reading plan.
- Plans are available that use Bibles designed for various reading levels and abilities, covering ages 2 to 12.
- You can read to your child, or they can read on their own. If they read on their own, be sure
 to discuss readings together and encourage them to ask questions!
- On weeks with no readings, feel free to take the week off, revisit previous stories, or focus on prayer. Since none of these children's books cover Psalms or Proverbs, another option is to read from a "Psalms for Kids" or "Proverbs for Kids" book on these off weeks.

The Story for Little Ones, Children, and Kids

These three books form a parallel set of content for different ages. They are broken into the same 31 stories/chapters, covering the same content in ways appropriate for each age group.






The Jesus Storybook Bible

This storybook Bible uses each story, New Testament *and* Old, to point to Jesus and "God's Never Stopping, Never Giving Up, Unbreaking, Always and Forever Love." These stories are engaging for a wide age range, and many adults enjoy them as much as children.

Egermeier's Bible Story Book

First written and compiled over 100 years ago(!), this classic is made up of 312 biblical stories that are already presented in chronological order! It is more comprehensive than the books mentioned above without requiring children to read every word of scripture. This option is best suited for experienced readers or for families of elementary age children who want to read aloud together. A few of the scheduled weekly readings are substantial and require patience and pacing.
